

## HISTORY OF THE WSF REFEREE PROGRAMME

- The concept of International Referees was first identified and approved in concept at the first International Referees' Conference held in conjunction with the Men's World Championships in Cairo, November 1985.
- The second International Referees' Conference was held in conjunction with the Men's World Open in Toulouse in November 1986 and the IR qualifications and procedures for appointment were approved. Coincidentally, this was the event where Ross Norman defeated Jahangir Khan in the World Open Final, thus ending Jahangir's incredible 5½-year undefeated streak. Was there a connection? Who knows? At that event, the first five International Referees were named: David Donnelly (Australia), Marcus Fischer (Sweden), Mike Fitchett (Scotland), Chris Foo (Malaysia), John Haines (New Zealand) and Graham Waters (Canada).
